

"A WEEK ON THE WILDSIDE" SPECIAL OFFER TIME & TIDE SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK CAMPS CHOSEN BY TIME & TIDE 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO ARRIVAL



DAY ONE

Arrive into Lusaka International Airport where you are met and assisted to board your flight to Mfuwe National Park. On arrival you are met by Time & Tide and transferred to Luwi Camp on an all-inclusive basis. For illustrative purposes we have chosen 2 nights at Luwi, 2 nights Nsolo and 3 nights Kakuli as the itinerary.

Situated deep in the national park on the ephemeral Luwi River, Luwi is wonderfully remote, with no other camps or people for miles around. Tranquillity envelops this camp, creating a wilderness haven that allows guests to reconnect with nature in a meaningful way.

Nestled in a grove of ancient mahogany trees, the 5 tented suites are designed to fully immerse guests into the bush experience. Set along the riverbed and overlooking the floodplains below, you can watch the abundant wildlife from your suite. Feathertop beds, an open air, en-suite bathroom and peaceful seating area create a comfortable guest experience in this seasonal camp.

A permanent oxbow lagoon next to camp attracts wildlife especially during the dry winter months. A wildlife hide overlooks the resident hippo pod and offers excellent sightings of the lagoon's frequent wildlife visitors - ranging from thirsty lions to large herds of elephants.



DAY THREE

Today you are transferred by game drive to Nsolo Camp for 2 nights on an all-inclusive basis.

One of the more historical safari camps in Zambia Nsolo Camp is the quintessential 'barefoot luxury' experience. Nestled along the banks of the seasonal Luwi River, a permanent river lagoon attracts a daily parade of wildlife that you can watch from your suite's private deck.

With a design inspired by its intimate riverside setting, Nsolo's 5 comfortable suites sit on raised wooden platforms - each one offering views over the surrounding bush. The Luwi River is renowned for its lion and wild dog population. Various lion prides use the dry riverbed as a thoroughfare and a means not only of locating their prey, but also their rivals who must be warned to stay away.



DAY FIVE

Today you are transferred by game drive to Kakuli for 3 nights on an all-inclusive basis.

Perched high above the Luangwa River, Kakuli offers impressive vistas of the river's many visitors below. The 5 suites have a long, low profile and a bright, airy feel and comfort in all seasons by incorporating features such as a covered open-air lounge and indoor and outdoor showers. Right from your suite, you can listen to the bellowing hippos, see bee-eaters perform their aerial acrobatics and watch elephants and giraffes wandering down to the river.

The elevated main chitenge and deck overlook the river and a permanent waterhole. Beneath the lounge is a wildlife hide that offers up-close views of the wildlife stopping by for a drink.

In the dry season, the camp is a fantastic base for exploring by vehicle and foot. The area is renowned for some of the best game viewing opportunities in Zambia, with abundant leopards, a resident lion pride and a seasonal colony of the immensely beautiful carmine bee-eaters.



DAY EIGHT

Today you are transferred back to Mfuwe Airport for your flight back to Lusaka and connecting flight home.

You can extend this safari for more time in the South Luangwa National Park, the Lower Zambezi National Park and Livingstone – please ask!

Alternatively you can fly to Malawi for a few nights rest and relaxation on Lake Malawi or enjoy a further safari in one of Malawi's many national parks.



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
